- 4. According to the tithe maps, what was the original name of the large tree covered triangle in Lower Walton?
- 5. Where can a section of the Old Quay canal still be seen today?
- 6. Which two waterways did Walton Lock once connect?
- 7. How many brave soldiers from Walton were lost in the two World Wars?
- 8. What is a 'Traveller's Rest' and where can one be found in Lower Walton?
- 9. The walled garden at Walton Lea once belonged to which mansion?
- 10. What is Five's Court and where can one of these be found in Walton?
- 11. Currently, there are no schools in Walton. In the past there have been two schools for girls of infant and primary ages. Where are these former school buildings situated?
- 12. For whom was Walton Hall originally built for?
- 13.In which year did Warrington Borough Council purchase Walton Hall and Gardens?
- 14. Who paid for the construction of St Johns's Church, Walton and what were the construction costs at the time?
- 15. What is a "Lucy Box" and where can one of these be found in Walton
- 16.All sections of the Bridgewater Canal were finally completed in 1995. Why was this waterway built?
- 17. Five bridges cross the Bridgewater Canal within the parish of Walton, what are their names?
- 18. Within the churchyard of St John's Church here is a smallpox grave. How many people were buried here during the 1892/3 small pox epidemic?
- 19. Within Walton there were once three water mills. Which mill is still in existence and where is it situated?
- 20. Who was responsible for redeveloping Higher Walton village in the late 1800s and early 1900s?
