

HERITAGE SPOTLIGHT

Did you know that large tree covered triangle, across from The Stag in Lower Walton, has a name? It is called "Goose Croft". This name appears on the 1850's parish tithe map. The name Goose Croft suggests a previous use of the land, when it was an area of common ground within the parish that was used for the village geese. On the corner of Goose Croft, where the bus shelter now stands, there used to be a toll house for the paying of tolls for passage along the old turnpike road.

GRAFFITI

We were dismayed to see unsightly graffiti on the 'Tommy' soldier next to the War Memorial, on our Parish Noticeboard and on the utility buildings next to the War Memorials. We wish to thank the local police for working with us on this, and all those who helped in the clean up.
